



Help Alleviate Traffic Congestion on the Road to Hāna

We ask for your kōkua in advising your guests about the Hāna traffic congestion being caused by increased vehicle traffic, illegal parking, and unsafe pedestrian crossing along Hāna Highway. Please advise your guests who are considering driving to Hāna of the following:

- **Join a tour** from a permitted tour company instead of driving on your own, or visit other areas on Maui. Here is a list of companies that offer tours to Hāna, compiled by the Maui Visitors and Convention Bureau.

- If you decide to drive:
 - **Be aware of the no parking signs** on Hāna Highway. There is a \$35 no parking fine and a \$200 surcharge for illegally stopping on a state highway. The Maui Police Department is actively issuing citations and warnings to those who are in violation.
 - **Adhere to the Road to Hāna Code of Conduct:**
 1. Visit State parks and County rest facilities.
 2. Enjoy the various farms, botanical gardens and fruit stands along the way.
 3. Avoid sites located on or beyond private properties, and areas that lack visitor welcoming signage.
 4. Park in designated parking stalls. Vehicles protruding onto the highway are subject to being towed.
 5. Do not enter streams on occasions of heavy rains and flash flooding conditions.
 6. Please respect the 'āina (land): place trash in a proper receptacle, stay on the paths, respect the wildlife and plants, and practice safe procedures.
 - The road to Hāna is an unfamiliar and winding road. It is a full-day adventure and will take a lot longer than expected. Check the weather forecast for Hāna before heading out.

Wai‘ānapanapa State Park

- *Advanced reservations* are required for all vehicles and walk-in entry to visit Wai‘ānapanapa State Park.
 - Reservations may be made up to 14 days in advance, and no later than the day before your visit.
 - To make reservations visit: www.gowaiianapanapa.com
 - Travelers without reservations should not drive down Honokalani Road to the park, as they will be directed to turn around and drive back out. This is a fairly narrow, residential road, and currently the only access and exit road to the park from Hāna Highway.
