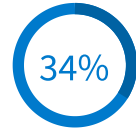

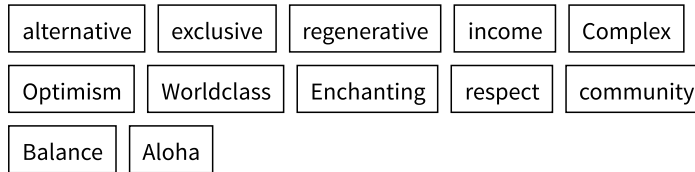

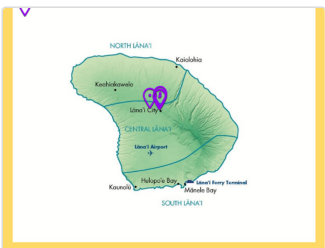

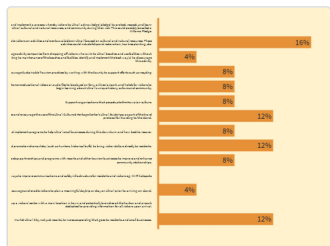

Response options	Count	Percentage
Develop and implement a process whereby visitors to Lānaʻi acknowledge (pledge) to protect, respect, and learn about Lānaʻi cultural and natural resources, and community during their visit. This could possibly be called a Mālama Pledge.	0	0%
Educate visitors on activities and events available on Lānaʻi focused on cultural and natural resources. These activities could include fishpond restoration, koa tree planting, etc.	4	16%
Discourage activity companies from dropping off visitors who swim to Lānaʻi beaches and use facilities without contributing to maintenance of the beaches and facilities. Identify and implement the best way(s) to discourage this activity.	1	4%
Encourage Sustainable Tourism practices by working with the County to support efforts such as recycling	2	8%
Create more educational videos or audio files to be played on ferry, airlines/airport, and hotels for visitors to begin learning about Lānaʻi's unique history, culture and community.	2	8%
Support organizations that perpetuate the Hawaiian culture.	2	8%
Enhance and encourage the use of the Lānaʻi Culture & Heritage Center's Lānaʻi Guide App as part of the travel protocol for traveling to the island.	3	12%

Develop and promote niche markets, (such as hunters, historical buffs) to bring visitor dollars directly to residents.	3	12%
Develop partnerships and programs with resorts and other tourism businesses to improve and enhance community relationships.	2	8%
Explore ways to improve communications and safety infrastructure for residents and visitors e.g. Wi-Fi hotspots	0	0%
Encourage and enable visitors to plan a meaningful daytrip or stay on Lānaʻi prior to arriving on island.	1	4%

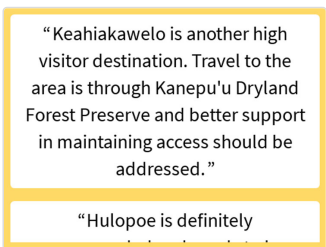

Keahiakawelo is another high visitor destination. Travel to the area is through Kanepu'u Dryland Forest Preserve and better support in maintaining access should be addressed.

Hulopoe is definitely overcrowded and needs to be managed wisely.

Keep the eastern Coastline for the use of Lanai residents and don't publicize it.

Implement a user fee for Hulopoe Beach Park so day visitors don't assume they can just use the park facilities for free.

Kaiolohia is a much visited and under-managed area.
