## KE HOLO NEI KA HOʻOMĀKAUKAU NO KA HOʻOLAULEʻA PĀKĪPIKA KŪIKAWĀ

HONOLULU, HI – He 'ehā mahina koe a hō'ea mai nā hoakipa no ka Ho'olaule'a No'eau A Mo'omeheu Pākīpika (FESTPAC), a ua mālama 'ia he 'aha nūhou i kēia lā e nā komikina e alaka'i nei i ka ho'olaule'a. E mālama 'ia ana ka ho'olaule'a ma nā lā 10-21 o lune, 2020 me nā hanana like 'ole ma 'ō a 'ō o Honolulu me Waikīkī. 'O ka makamua kēia o ko Hawai'i mālama 'ana i kēia ho'olaule'a.

Ke hoʻomākaukau nei ke kōmike no nā hoakipa he mau kaukani mai nā mokupuni Pākīpika a ma 'ō aku. 'O "E Kū I Ka Hoe Uli" ka mākia o kēia makahiki.

"He hoʻomanaʻo ko mākou mākia i ke kūlana alakaʻi o nā kupa o ka Pākīpika ma ka hoʻokele ʻana i ka huli aniau o ka honua a me nā hopena o kēia huliau i ko mākou piko," wahi a Kenekoa English, ka luna hoʻomalu o ke kōmike FESTPAC. "He hoʻomanaʻo kēia i nā ʻōpio e maliu i ke aʻoaʻo a nā kūpuna – e hoʻomau i nā moʻolelo a e hoʻōla i ka moʻomeheu a me ka ʻike kupuna."

He ho'olaule'a holoholo 'o FESTPAC i mālama 'ia ma kekahi 'āina Pākīpika 'oko'a i kēlā

me kēia makahiki 'ehā. Ua ho'okumu 'ia e ka hui Pacific Community i mea e ho'opakele i nā no'eau mo'omeheu ma o ke ka'ana 'ana aku. Ua mālama 'ia ka South Pacific Arts Festival mua loa ma Pīkī ma ka makahiki 1972. Ua kapa 'ia ka inoa Festival of Pacific Arts & Culture i ka makahiki 1980. Ke ho'omākaukau nei 'o Hawai'i e ho'okipa i nā lāhui Pākīpika he iwakālua a 'oi i kēia makahiki.

Ma nā lā 11 o ka hoʻolauleʻa, e mālama ʻia he Kauhale, nā kūkākūkā moʻomeheu, a me nā hōʻikeʻike. E mālama ʻia ana ka ʻaha wehena ma ka Hale Aliʻi o ʻlolani, a e mālama ʻia ana ka ʻaha panina ma Kapiʻolani Pāka.

'O ka mālama olakino, ka ho'ohale, ke kia'i palekana, a he nui hou aku nā kumuhana e kūkākūkā 'ia nei e ke kōmike ho'olālā. Mahalo nā komikina FESTPAC i ke kāko'o o ka 'Aha'ōlelo, nā ke'ena moku'āina, ke Kalana 'o Honolulu, a me nā hoa kāko'o.

'O ke Ke'ena Kuleana Ho'okipa o Hawai'i (HTA) kekahi o nā hoa kāko'o nui. Ua ho'olaha mai nei ka Pelekikena a Luna Ho'okele Chris Tatum i ke kāko'o he \$500,000 no ka ho'olaule'a.

"He hō'oia ko mākou kāko'o i kēia hanana kūikawā i ka hiki i nā hoa kipa ke 'ike kino i ka nani o Hawai'i, a a'o no ka ho'oilina nāna i alaka'i i nā welo e kū nei i kēia lā," wahi a Tatum.

Ke hana alu like nei nā komikina FESTPAC me nā hoa kākoʻo e like me Nā Kula ʻo Kamehameha a me ke Kulanui o Hawaiʻi no ka hoʻohale i nā ʻelele mai nā ʻāina Pākīpika.

Ua komo nā 'elele Hawai'i i nā ho'olaule'a FESTPAC a pau mai ka makahiki 1976 a hiki i kēia. No ke komikina a kumu hula Snowbird Bento, he 'elele no Hawai'i ma nā ho'olaule'a i hala, he ho'āla ka ho'olaule'a i ka ha'aheo o ka Hawai'i.

"He mea nui ko Hawai'i mālama 'ana i ka FESTPAC i wahi ho'omana'o i ko mākou piko – no ka nani kūhohonu o nā kūpuna, 'a'ole ho'i kau palena 'ia ka Hawai'i 'ana," wahi a Bento.

Ua mālama 'ia ka 'aha nūhou o kēia lā ma ka mahina ho'ohanohano 'ōlelo Hawai'i. No ka 'ike hou pili iā FESTPAC Hawai'i 2020, e like me ka papamanawa a me nā kahua ho'olaule'a, e kele aku iā festpachawaii.org.

## PREPARATIONS FOR HISTORIC PACIFIC FESTIVAL ARE UNDERWAY

June 10-21, 2020

**HONOLULU**, **HI** – With the Festival of the Pacific Arts & Culture or FESTPAC less than four months out, event <u>commissioners</u> held a news conference today announcing numerous preparations underway. <u>FESTPAC will run from June 10-21, 2020</u> with events being held throughout Honolulu and Waikiki. It will be the first time that Hawaii will serve as FESTPAC host.

Thousands of Pacific Islanders and visitors are expected to attend FESTPAC. This year's theme is: E ku i ka hoe uli (Take hold of the steering paddle).

"Our theme serves as a reminder to every Pacific Islander, that we are leading global discussions on climate change and its effect on the very identity of our island cultures," said Senator English, who serves as FESTPAC Hawaii Chairman. "It is a reminder to our young leaders to heed the call of our elders – to perpetuate and carry on our stories and practice our culture and ancestral knowledge."

FESTPAC is a traveling festival hosted every four years by a different Oceania country. It was started by the Pacific Community as a means to stem erosion of traditional cultural practices by sharing and exchanging culture at each festival. The first South Pacific Arts Festival was held in Fiji in 1972. In 1980, the event became the Festival of Pacific Arts &

Culture. Delegates from <u>more than twenty oceanic nations</u> are expected to participate in this year's event.

Throughout the 11 days there will be a Festival Village, cultural exchange and discussions, performances and exhibits. Opening ceremonies are slated to occur at Iolani Palace; and, closing ceremonies will take place at Kapiolani Park.

Health, housing, security, and other precautionary measures are all part of FESTPAC planning. FESTPAC Commissioners acknowledged that the event could not take place without the strong support of the Legislature, State agencies, Honolulu County and numerous sponsors.

The Hawaii Tourism Authority (HTA) is among the key sponsors of FESTPAC. HTA President and CEO Chris Tatum announced an allocation of \$500,000 for the festival.

"Our investment in this historic event is to ensure that all who come to FESTPAC Hawaii will experience the beauty of our state and learn about our unique history that guides our values today," said Tatum.

FESTPAC Commissioners have worked with other sponsor partners including Kamehameha Schools and the University of Hawaii to assist in housing Pacific Island delegates.

A Hawaii delegation has participated in every FESTPAC since 1976. FESTPAC Commissioner and Kumu Hula Snowbird Bento is among the former delegates who represented Hawaii at past festivals. She called the experiences, "eye opening."

"It's important for Hawaii to host FESTPAC, so we can remember who we are – that we come from a really rich legacy, because I think a lot of people have relegated in their minds that Hawaiians only exist in certain venues," said Bento.
