




## 05/08/20 Hawaii Passenger Arrivals by Air Update

Yesterday, 756 people arrived in Hawaii including 239 visitors and 214 residents. Yesterday marked six weeks since the state's mandatory 14-day self-quarantine started for all passengers arriving in Hawaii from out of state. The quarantine order was expanded on April 1st to include interisland travelers. This table shows the number of people who arrived by air from out of state yesterday and does not include interisland travel.




#### 7-Day Domestic by Island Moving Average Daily Passenger Volume





## Travel Agency Bookings to Hawaii for Future Arrivals\* Based on a 7-day Moving Average, 2020 vs 2019 U.S.




## Travel Agency Bookings to Hawaii for Future Arrivals\* Based on a 7-day Moving Average, 2020 vs 2019 Japan




