Hawai'i Passenger Arrivals By Air

HONOLULU – Yesterday, 966 people arrived in Hawaiʻi. During this same time last year, nearly 30,000 passengers arrived in Hawaiʻi daily, including residents and visitors. The state's mandatory 14-day self-quarantine started on March 26th for all passengers arriving in Hawaiʻi from out of state. The quarantine order was expanded on April 1st to include interisland travelers. This table shows the number of people who arrived by air from out of state yesterday and does not include interisland travel. This data was collected from the Hawaiʻi Department of Transportation's (DOT) new Mandatory Travel Declaration Form.

Crew = flight crew members

Transit = people who are in transit to another location through Hawai'i and aren't leaving the airport **Military** = military exempt personnel

Exempt = people who are exempt from the 14-day quarantine after receiving prior approval from the state

Relocate to Hawai'i = people who are moving to Hawai'i

Returning Resident = people who indicate on the DOT's form that they're returning residents **Visitor** = people who are not in the above categories

The following table shows what the Oʻahu visitors indicated as the purpose of their trip, and they can choose more than one. This data was collected from the DOT's new Mandatory Travel Declaration Form.
