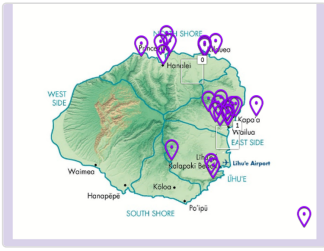

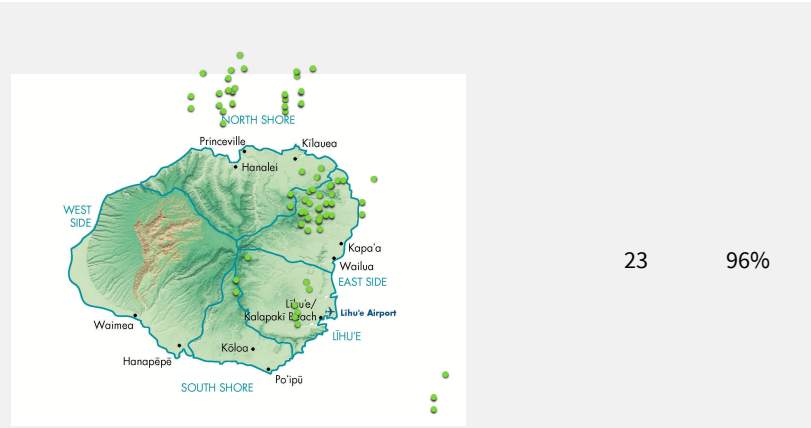

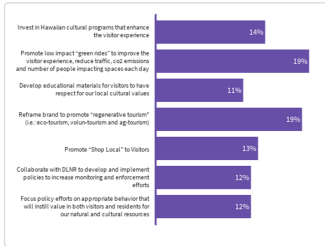

## Responses

- Create Kauai resident identification and vehicle stickers or placards
- Have HTA get behind a way of limiting number of cars and visitors. Volume control is the only way we can get quality tourists
- Code words for "promoting hotel over the future of our people" is pretending AirBnB and/or VRBO are the enemy, rather than the salvation from starvation and destitution!!!
- Cultural education in our public schools so that our kieki will be able to educate future tourists.
- Bike rentals at hotels in appropriate bike safe locations
- ReBrand Kauai as a "study a borad" destination or 3 - 6-month remote worker destination. Create programs that cater to 3 - 6 educational of Kauai and "green" innovative sustainable permaculture technologies ( like a real-life Disney world for sustainability)
- Make sure hanalei bay doesn't turn into a sewer!!
- No greenwashing or pretending re: sustainable tourism
- Expand bookie paths
- Continue working with KIUC to wean Kaua'i off fossil fuels.
- Real activities that represent Hawai'i
- Make popular places on a Reservation system for visitors, then have regular commercial free days for residents.
- Legislate limits? Can charter place limits?
- visitor behavior modification in all settings through pre arrival tools
- Consider the impact of individual paid tourist activities and reduce or illuminate those with greatest impact For least benefit. Example: helicopter tours ruin the peace of thousands for the benefit of a few.
- more bike lanes
- Better and more shuttle transportation to tourist visited locations.
- Reduce disruption created by air tour helicopters and planes.
- Support getting visitors out if rental cars and into convenient shuttles
- Make another road
- Have a limit on how many helicopters can fly per day & how many days they fly.
- More fees for use
- Stop letting Planning Department sue our people!
