

### Fact Sheet: Benefits of Hawai'i's Tourism Economy

#### Hawai'i Tourism Industry in June 2022<sup>1</sup>

Prior to the global COVID-19 pandemic, Hawai'i achieved record-level visitor expenditures and arrivals in 2019 through February 2020. On March 26, 2020, the state implemented mandatory quarantine and travel restrictions. Subsequently, nearly all trans-Pacific and interisland flights were canceled, cruise ship activities were suspended and tourism to the islands all but shut down. In October 2020, the state initiated the Safe Travels program, which allowed travelers to bypass quarantine if they had a valid negative COVID test. Through March 25, 2022, domestic passengers could bypass the state's mandatory self-quarantine if they were vaccinated or have a negative COVID pre-travel test. The Safe Travels Program ended on March 26, 2022. In June 2022, passengers arriving on direct international flights through June 11 were subjected to federal U.S. entry requirements which included proof of an up-to-date vaccination document and negative COVID-19 test result taken within one day of travel, or documentation of having recovered from COVID-19 in the past 90 days, prior to their flight. This requirement was lifted on June 12, 2022. There were no travel restrictions for passengers arriving to Hawai'i on domestic direct flights from the U.S. Mainland.

Total spending by visitors who came to the islands in June 2022 was \$1.83 billion, an increase of 12.3 percent compared to the \$1.63 billion reported for June 2019. A total of 842,927 visitors came in June 2022. Of the total visitors, 841,809 arrived by air service, mainly from the U.S. West and U.S. East. Additionally, 1,118 visitors arrived by cruise ships. In comparison, 947,112 visitors (-11%) arrived by air (946,373 visitors, -11%) and by cruise ships (738 visitors, +51.5%) in June 2019. The average length of stay by all visitors in June 2022 was 9.44 days, up from 8.80 days (+7.2%) in June 2019. The statewide average daily census² was 265,157 visitors in June 2022 compared to 277,930 visitors (-4.6%) in June 2019

#### Hawai'i Tourism Industry in June 2022 Year-to-Date

- > Total Visitor Spending: \$9.23 billion, up 4.2 percent from \$8.86 billion in the first half of 2019.
- > State Tax Revenue (direct, indirect and induced): \$1.07 billion, compared to \$1.03 billion (+3.5%) in the first half of 2019.
- Visitor Arrivals: 4,431,332 visitors, down 14.3 percent from 5,171,182 visitors in the first half of 2019.
- > Average Daily Census: 227,364 visitors, compared to 249,959 visitors (-9%) in the first half of 2019.
- Total flights: 30,289 trans-Pacific flights and 6,312,102 seats compared to 30,729 flights and 6,750,177 seats in the first half of 2019.

#### **TAT Collections**


- FY 2018: The state collected \$554.9 million in TAT; an increase of 9.2 percent compared to FY 2017. (The TAT rate was increased to 10.25 percent, effective January 1, 2018. Tax revenues generated to be allocated to the Mass Transit Special Fund).
- > FY 2019: The state collected \$600.3 million in TAT; an increase of 8.2 percent compared to FY 2018.
- > FY 2020: The state collected \$564.3 million in TAT, down 6.0 percent compared to FY 2019.
- FY 2021: The state collected \$209.1 million in TAT; a decrease of 62.7 percent compared to FY 2020.
- FY2022: Through June 2022, the state collected \$738.7 million in TAT, up 23 percent compared to \$600.3 million collected in FY 2019 through June 2019 (Preliminary data from Dept of Taxation).

#### Hawai'i Tourism Industry in 2021

- > Total Visitor Spending: \$13.0 billion. Visitor spending declined 26.6 percent from \$17.7 billion in 2019.
- > State Tax Revenue (direct, indirect and induced): \$1.52 billion; a decrease of 26.6 percent from \$2.07 billion in 2019.
- Visitor Arrivals: 6,777,498 visitors (+150.3%), more than double the arrival count of 2,708,258 from 2020. Total visitor arrivals decreased 34.7 percent compared to the 10,386,673 visitors in 2019.
- Average Daily Census: 179,022 visitors; compared to 78,305 visitors in 2020, versus 247,564 visitors in 2019.
- Jobs supported (direct, indirect, induced): 158,000
- Total flights: 51,904, Total Seats: 10,735,084; compared to 24,372 flights and 5,318,667 seats in 2020, versus 61,778 flights and 13,619,247 seats in 2019.

#### Hawai'i Tourism Industry in 2020

- > Visitor Spending: NA<sup>3</sup>
- State Tax Revenue (direct, indirect and induced): NA
- Visitor Arrivals (Air and Cruise): 2,708,258 (-73.9% compared to 2019).
- Average Daily Census: 77,915 visitors (-68.3% compared to 2019).
- Air Seats: 5,318,667 (-60.9% versus 2019).

#### Hawai'i Tourism Industry in 2019

- ➤ Visitor Spending (Air and Cruise): \$17.72 billion (+1.2%, +\$206.4 million YOY versus 2018).
- State Tax Revenue (direct, indirect and induced): \$2.07 billion (+1.2%, +\$24.1 million YOY versus 2018).
- Visitor Arrivals (Air and Cruise): 10,386,673 (+5.0% YOY versus 2018).
- Average Daily Census: 247,564 visitors (+2.4% versus 2018).
- Jobs supported (direct, indirect, induced): 216,000
- Air Seats: 13,619,349 (+2.9% YOY versus 2018).
